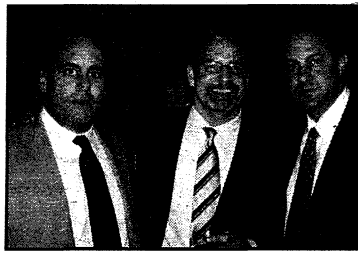
FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT INDUSTRY LEADERS CELEBRATE New Destiny Housing Corp. holds 10th Anniversary cocktail benefit

NEW YORK, NY With the illuminated towers of corporate high rises and the Empire State Building shining as a backdrop, a capacity crowd filled the 56th floor glass-enclosed Sky Club of the MetLife Building on October 25, 2005, for New Destiny Housing Corporation's 10th anniversary cocktail benefit.

Leading representatives from finance, banking, real estate development and related industries turned out in force to celebrate the nonprofit organization's first decade of providing affordable housing for domestic violence survivors and other low income New York City residents.

The evening also paid tribute to honorees Emily Youssouf, president of New York City Housing Development Corp. (HDC) and Matthew Gottsegen, AIA, partner, Franke, Gottsegen, Cox Architects.

Under Youssouf, HDC has been implementing mayor Michael Bloomberg's \$3 billion plan to produce 65,000 units of affordable housing over five years. Accepting the award, Youssouf said, "Any organization that can ease the pain of domestic violence is vital to making America a more humane society."
