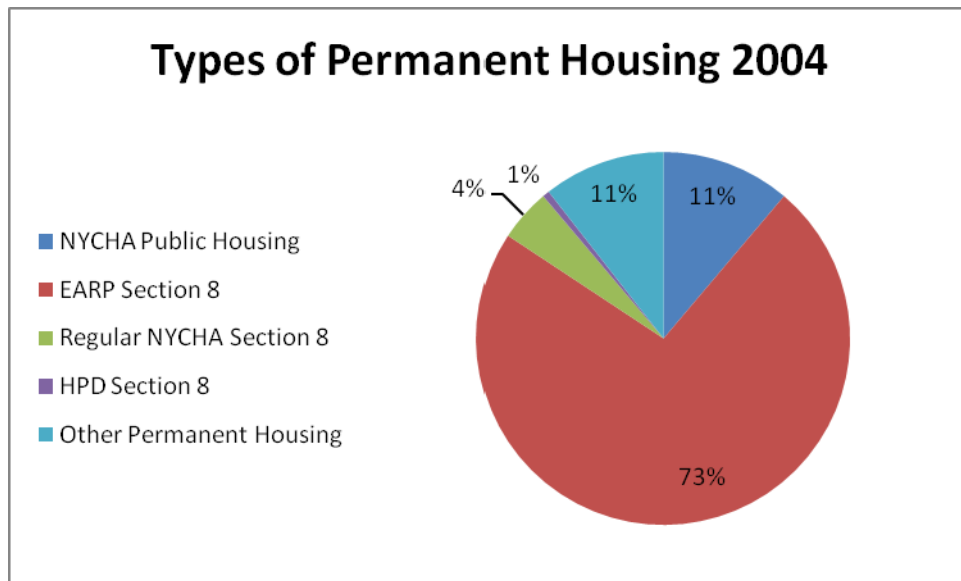

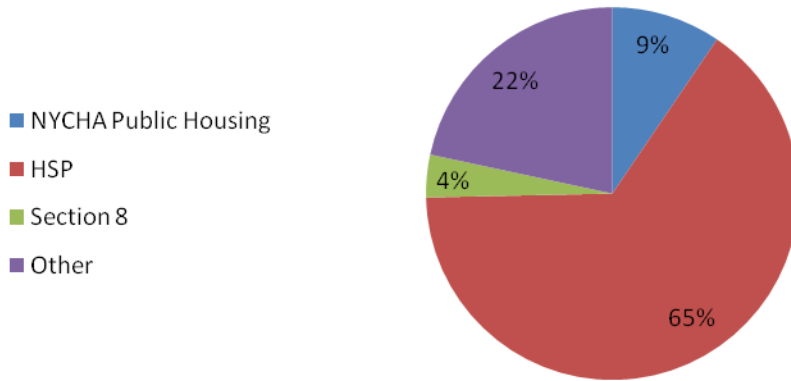

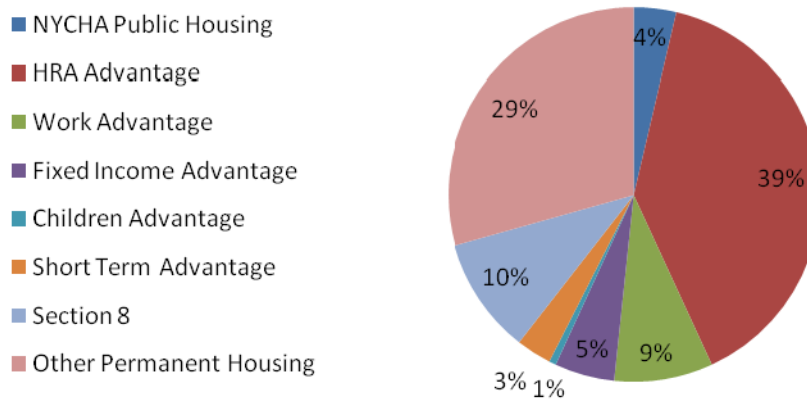
### Types of Permanent Housing Discharges from Emergency Shelter



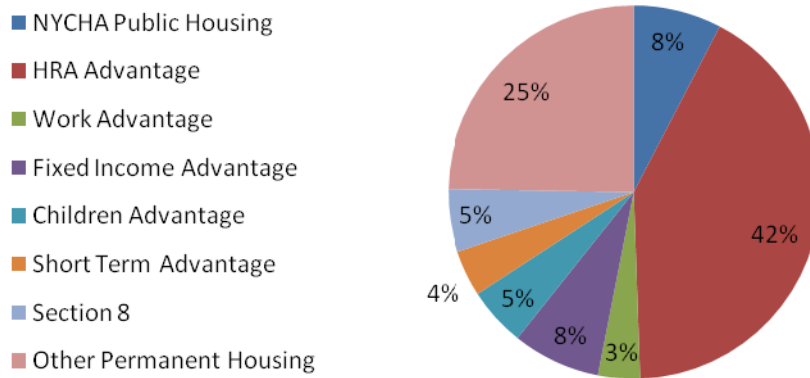
## Types of Permanent Housing 2006

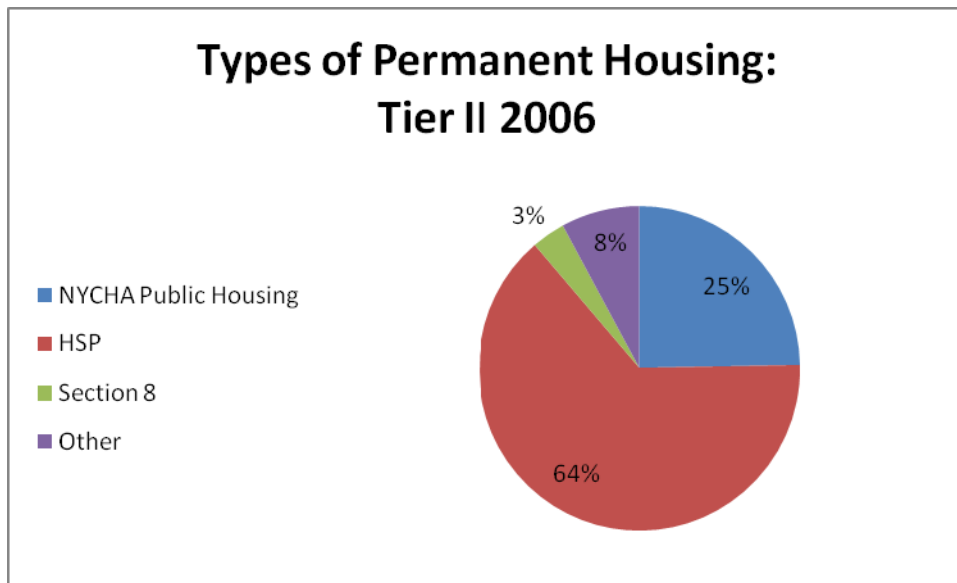

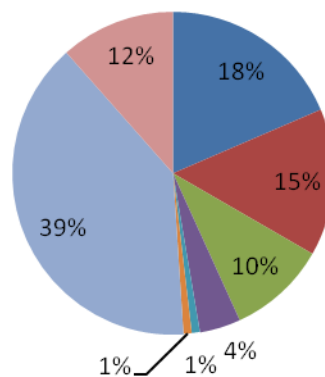
